


Brookings School District Bobcat Tracks Plan ~ Revisions and Recommendations

Recommended Bobcat Tracks plan revisions



- Eliminate hybrid option
- Shift mask mandate to Phase III rather than Phase II
- New Phase II becomes "Masks Strongly Recommended" with mitigation efforts such as limited visitors.

 Phase III mask mandate would reflect the practices of the 2020-21 school year such as pod students in schools and at recess, limiting visitors including participation by spectators at events, and other mitigation efforts.




Recommended Phase Change

Phase I	Phase II	Phase III	Phase IV
Reinforce everyday preventative actions, ensuring proper ventilation within school facilities, including buses and maintaining cleaning and disinfection practices remain important. Face masks are optional.	Continue following strategies from phase I along with implementing mitigation strategies such as social distancing when possible, reinforcing everyday preventative actions, and maintaining cleaning and disinfection. Scheduled visitors are allowed. Face masks are strongly recommended.	Mitigation strategies are necessary. These include following actions ensuring that student and staff groupings/cohorts are as static as possible with limited mixing of student and staff groups, field trips are eliminated and large gatherings and events held with limited external participation. No building visitors allowed. Face masks are mandated.	Plans for virtual/remote learning will be in place in the event of a school closure.
