RE: School Board Report

1. Strategic Planning:

Now that the pillars have been defined, we have continued our work on scorecard development. This is some of the most important work we will do as it defines what is important to us under each pillar. Our contracted work with Studer is over; therefore, we must decide on the next steps. Surveys are the most appropriate way to assess engagement and satisfaction, although we do not have updated surveys in this area (2017). We utilized the strategic planning surveys last year but would need to purchase those specific to engagement and satisfaction tracking. I have asked Studer to provide a scaled quote for only the scorecard and survey creation. I did not feel there was support for a full phase of continuation, but we will need to determine the criteria for assessing engagement and satisfaction if not. I will have the updated quote by next week to share.

Scorecard work under each pillar was informally started last summer. Each area has multiple measures of success and, if consistently evaluated, provides evidence for intentional goal setting and district priorities. I've included four areas under each pillar that will begin to be explored further for measure and tool. Much of this work has been started, but the survey component must be determined before finalizing perception criteria.

2. Calendar:

BSD has traditionally drafted a 2-year calendar, and the 2024-2025 calendar is the second year of the rotation. It was decided last year that all schools would start simultaneously, and an after-Labor Day start would be necessary with the new construction. I have attached a draft calendar, but wanted to wait until January to approve. This is only a draft, as I didn't have confirmation from Pierce on the schedule until after the board agenda was approved last week, and time provides information that we are guessing about.

Pierce continues to believe the late start is necessary. Keep in mind that the main entrances at both schools have to wait for the existing schools to come down before they can be completed. A portion of Medary overlays into the new main entrance/lobby, which won't allow any foundations, structure, roof, glass, etc., to start until late May or even early June.

3. Disability Awareness Liasion:

Brookings has a Disability Awareness Committee, and after a great conversation with Mark Sternhagen and Jon Stauff, I've agreed to serve on the committee as a liaison for the Brookings School District. My role will not be a voting member but rather a conduit of information between our district and the committee. The committee hopes to hold a listening session focusing on the school district, and I will participate on our behalf. They have asked for my assistance to frame the session appropriately and work to create an agenda that promotes information sharing and dialogue for future outcomes.

BDAC Purpose Statement:

The Brookings Committee for People who have disabilities strives to advocate for the rights of people who have disabilities in our community. Throughout the year, specific events are held to bring awareness and information to our citizens. Informal guidance is provided to the business community, private individuals, governmental entities, and nonprofit organizations. The goals of this service are to improve the quality of life for people with disabilities through enhancing the knowledge base of entities in the community and to further serve as a community-based advocacy group enhancing the ability of local entities to comply with Federal Civil Rights legislation.

5. Facility

I have shared with the Facility Committee that I'd like to assess the high school facility and begin planning to replace aging infrastructure. Preliminary evaluations were conducted in 2018 on some of the district buildings, but we now need to prioritize the high school building. This work's scope can depend on the board's direction, but I will begin to research options. An asset condition summary is a certainty, as will be an operational study of the mechanical systems, etc.

6. School Funding and Accountability

As I shared with you last week, Governor Noem has proposed a 4% increase in school funding. This increase would go above the statutory limitation, and I am hopeful our legislature will support the proposal. Conversations surrounding accountability have also been prompted by the budget address. I have included information from BSD that can be found in the latest School Finance Accountability Board Report on General State Aid (Nov. 30, 2023).
