Natural Helpers



On October 28 and 29, the annual Natural Helpers training was conducted for the 25 nominated students from Mickelson Middle School. The 25 students were nominated by their classmates who identified their natural skills of listening and problem solving. Dodi Haug of the Northeast Prevention Resource Center in Watertown led the training at the Boys and Girls Club of Brookings. The two-day training develops the skills of listening, of identifying problems, of seeking solutions, of knowing when a problem is too big for a teenager to handle, and of referring to a professional for additional help.

The school counselors, Chad Adamson and Dannica Hoffman also assisted with the training. Adamson says that this is the 27th training that he has helped coordinate and believes that it had been going on for years before he started. The Natural

Helpers are a group of students prepared to be the eyes and ears available to the concerns of the student body. MMS always attempts to have 10% of the 8th grade trained before they enter high school. We are proud of these students, and we thank them for their service to their fellow classmates.
