A Great Place to Learn

Brookings High School ACT Performance Overview (2020-2024)

Brookings High School continues to demonstrate strong academic performance in ACT scores, consistently surpassing both the national and state averages. Below is a summary of our ACT results over the past four academic years, compared to the national and state benchmarks:

- National Average: 19
- State Average: 21
- Brookings High School Average: 23

Key Insights:

- Over the past four years, BHS has consistently outperformed both the state and national ACT averages. While the number of test-takers has varied, our students' composite scores have remained steady, reflecting a commitment to academic excellence.
- In the 2023-2024 academic year, BHS students achieved an average composite score of 23.5, the highest in the last four years, which continues to place us well above the state average of 21 and the national average of 19.

This ongoing trend of high ACT performance is a testament to the dedication of our educators and the hard work of our students.

A Great Place to Work


On the afternoon of October 11, Travis Jordan, author and former superintendent, delivered an inspiring talk to the Brookings High School staff.

Jordan encouraged teachers to recognize the unique gifts each student possesses, advocating for an approach to education that is centered on the individual rather than solely focused on academic metrics.

His message served as a powerful reminder of the importance of human connection in the learning environment, inspiring the BHS faculty to embrace a student-centered approach to education.

During the October meeting of the Principal's Student Advisory Committee, Brookings High School Administrators Mr. Justin Stanley and Mr. Zach Thomas invited Dr. Summer Schultz to speak with the students.
