April/May Highlights

1. Time for a Bobcat Bash



We will be celebrating positive behavior at MMS with our 2nd annual Bobcat Bash on Thursday, May 25. Students will be able to pick from a variety of choices offered by staff members. This is a culminating event for our work with PBIS (Positive Behavior Intervention Systems). Some new additions to our PBIS work for the 2023-24 year was the utilization of the SWISS program (which tracks our learner behaviors), and during second semester we implemented the

PBIS Rewards System with our Bobcat Store. The store was open on Fridays during lunch periods where learners were able to buy gum, pens, stickers, trinkets, Bobcat apparel, and also the opportunity to go have lunch with the principal. The store has been a huge success and this will continue into the next school year.

2. Building Transitions for Students

Current 8th grade students will be touring the High School to preview their fall admission to BHS. Students will hear from administration, the counseling department, and other students. They will get a tour of the building and have opportunities to ask questions. This time gives students to the opportunity to see what BHS has to offer them in the fall.

Current 5th grade students will be touring MMS to get a lay of the land for their upcoming fall transition. Students will be led by the counseling department, exploring the common areas in the building while having the opportunity to ask questions and become familiar with their new academic adventure.
